Description of Program Services

Site Coordination:

The role of the site coordinator is adaptable to the unique needs of a particular school. Are students getting enough food? Do they have access to required school supplies? Do they need one-on-one help with their studies? The coordinator is the key to improving student attendance and academic achievements by integrating services from the community into the schools. The site coordinator also manages volunteers and oversees individual student instruction for the after-school and tutoring programs.

Good Samaritan Readers:

Since children falling behind in literacy by fourth grade are more likely to drop-out of high school, we pair struggling readers in the first grade with volunteer tutors to provide one-on-one reading mentoring. Tutors meet with the student for one hour each week until the third grade. The mentor role emphasizes that an adult relationship is critical to academic success.

District-Wide Support

March Gladness: March Gladness is an annual community service event coordinated by Communities In Schools of Puyallup (CIS of Puyallup) that encourages K-12 students in the Puyallup School District to engage in local community service.

Sharing Resources: Each year we partner with local businesses, churches, service clubs and individuals to match the resources of our community with the needs of our students. CIS of Puyallup coordinates the distribution of donated resources such as back-packs, school supplies, grocery store gift cards, weekend backpacks of food, shoes and holiday meals.

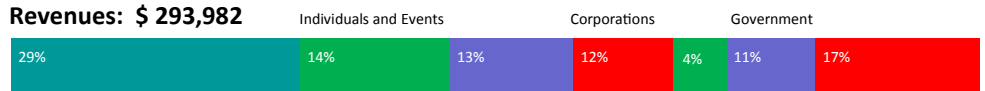

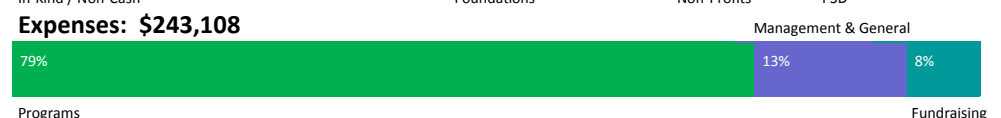
