


## Our Work

Our mission is to surround students with a community of support, empowering them to stay in school and achieve in life. During the 2018-19 school year, our Site Coordinators supported a total of 3,640 students as they took one step closer to graduation.




*Note: Each figure represents approximately 25 students.*

The Communities In Schools model has continuously been proven to decrease dropout rates, boost on-time graduation rates and improve overall education outcomes. Of the 229 students we worked most closely with during the 2018-19 school year:
